## Annual Meeting Minutes 2008

1. **Date:** 20 January 2008 following the 10:30AM service.
2. **Location:** St. Paul's Cathedral, Great Hall.
3. **Call to Order (Dean Richardson):** The 2008 Annual Meeting of St. Paul's Cathedral was called to order. The agenda for the meeting is provided as Attachment 1.
4. **Opening Prayer (Rev. Canon Mary Moreno Richardson):** An opening prayer was offered.
5. **Quorum (Bob Reed):** The Cathedral bylaws require that 100 members or a majority of the membership, whichever is less, be present to constitute a quorum. The Secretary of the Annual Meeting, Bob Reed, noted that the necessary number of members were present and declared a quorum.
6. **Approval of the 2007 Annual Meeting Minutes (Dean Richardson):** It was moved, seconded, and unanimously agreed by those present that the minutes of the 2005 Annual meeting be approved.
7. **Elections (Dean Richardson)**
  - a. **Chapter election:** Seven candidates were nominated to fill four Chapter vacancies. The candidates were Gillian Barr, Geoff Fowler, Roxanne Perfect-Knight, David Smith, Carol Walsh, Kyle West, and John Will.
  - b. **Diocene Convention Delegates:** It was moved, seconded, and unanimously agreed that Gillian Barr, Geoff Fowler, Roxanne Perfect-Knight, David Smith, Carol Walsh, Kyle West, and John Will be the Cathedral delegates to the next Diocene Convention.
8. **Reports**
  - a. **2006 Audit Results (Guin Kerstetter)** – A report of the 2006 audit results was presented. The audit included the Nutmeg & Olive LLC but not St. Paul's Senior Episcopal Homes, Inc. The audit was judged a clean opinion.
  - b. **2006 Financial Report (Jack Lentz)** – A brief report of the Cathedral financial situation at the end of 2007 was presented.

- c. **Endowment Board Report (Sam Ward)** – An Endowment Board report was presented. Board members were introduced. It was mentioned that Laura Gunn retired from the board with thanks and that Steve Bluhm was newly appointed.
- d. **2008 Budget Report (Guin Kerstetter)** – A summary of the Cathedral budget that was approved by the Chapter for 2008 was presented and discussed. Highlights from the budget were explained.
- e. **Compensation Sub-Committee (Guin Kerstetter)** – A Compensation Sub-committee was formed to develop recommendations for Cathedral staff compensation. The committee consists of Guin Kerstetter (chair), Jack Lentz, Jim Greer, and Bob Reed
- f. **Master Plan (Ken Tranbarger)** – Cathedral Master Plan progress in 2007 was presented. It was mentioned that the height of the Nutmeg building has been reduced to fully meet airport restrictions. The buildings otherwise are largely unchanged from previous reports.
- g. **Dean's Report (Dean Richardson)** – The Dean discussed the following subjects:
  - He recognized all of the volunteers, clergy (staff and non-stipendiary), and lay staff who contributed to the many Cathedral successes.
  - There are now five services on Sunday morning. A Compline service has been added. Misa en Español is now at 1:00PM rather than 9:15AM. More services have Spanish content.
  - The Presiding Bishop will be at the Cathedral in April.
  - The organ is in need of renovation. Two bids for that work have been solicited. The Rev. David Norgard has been contracted to complete a feasibility study for a fund drive for the organ.
  - Luisa Bonillas has been added to the Cathedral staff and is largely responsible for education. This is possible due to a generous grant by Cathy Hopper.
  - Fifty people are currently part of the Via Media and the Cathedral incorporation class.
  - The Dorcas House Board is continuing its good work supporting the foster home in Tijuana. .07% of our income has been directed toward the Millennium Goals in accordance with the Presiding Bishop's recommendation.
  - Mike Angell is now the chaplain at UCSD.
9. **Chapter Election Results (Dean Richardson):** Gillian Barr, Roxanne Perfect-Knight, Carol Walsh, and John Will were elected to the Cathedral Chapter on the first ballot.
10. **Presentation of the Robinson Cross (Dean Richardson)** – The Robinson Cross is awarded every year to outstanding, long-time Cathedral members. This year Robinson Crosses went to Ann Gary and Kathleen Ford.
11. **Outgoing Chapter Appreciation (Bob Reed)** – Appreciation was expressed for the contributions of retiring Chapter members Dru Campbell, Martin Hall, Mary Rathbun, and Bob Reed.
12. **Naming of the Dean's Warden (Dean Richardson)** – The Dean appointed Bart Smoot to be Dean's Warden for 2008.
13. **Nomination of the Dean to Chapter (Bob Reed)** – It was moved and seconded that the Dean continues as a member of the Cathedral Chapter. The motion was seconded and passed by acclamation.

14. **Adjournment:** The Dean declared that the Annual Meeting was adjourned.

15. **Closing Prayer:** The Rev. Canon Allisyn Thomas offered a closing prayer.

## VOTING GUIDELINES

### ***From the Bylaws of the Cathedral Church of St. Paul:***

#### ***Section 3.01.1 Definitions***

... "Adult Members" of St Paul's Cathedral include members sixteen years of age and over...

... "Regular pledging contributor of record" means:

a member of this Cathedral,

who makes a monetary pledge to the Cathedral according to the Cathedral's official records, and

(3) who makes regular payments on that pledge or makes a good faith effort to do so...

#### ***Section 3.02 VOTING RIGHTS***

For all matters requiring the vote or consent of Cathedral members, including voting for delegates to the annual Diocesan Convention, Chapter membership, and other matters, a person is qualified to vote if that person:

- a) is an adult member of the Cathedral as defined in Section 3.01;
- b) has been a regular pledging contributor of record to the Cathedral for the 210 days prior to the vote; and,
- c) is a regular attendant at worship.

## Cathedral Liturgy

---

As it states on our website, *"In... worship, we join with others to acknowledge the holiness of God, to hear God's Word, to offer prayer, and to celebrate the sacraments."* It is in that spirit that liturgy is planned in the Cathedral.

Some of the highlights of the last year include:

- Welcoming new persons into the body of Christ and the Cathedral community: 19 persons were baptized throughout the year and at the Easter Vigil service, 21 persons were confirmed, 3 were received, and 1 reaffirmed his baptismal vows. In addition we welcomed persons who joined the Cathedral as new members at the 10:30 services on Trinity Sunday. In addition, 8 people were baptized at our 1:00 Misa.
- Through PACEM, we continued to offer a chanted Compline service every Sunday evening at 8:30 PM.
- The Rev. Phillip Newell, a renowned expert on Celtic Spirituality, facilitated a weekend workshop on Celtic Spirituality in February which included a Eucharist for Peace and preaching at the 8:00 and 10:30 Sunday services.
- The Cathedral hosted several Diocesan services including a bi-lingual service with our Presiding Bishop, Katharine Jefferts-Schori serving as Presider and Preacher; a Eucharist with Bishop Lino of Mexico; and the Ordination of Deacons, in which The Rev. Tom Wilson, sponsored by the Cathedral, was ordained to the Diaconate.
- We held two special services here in support of our opposition to Proposition 8. The first, "Make the Right Call, Stand on the Side of Love," was an interfaith service followed by a press conference on why, in the words of Dean Richardson, we opposed Proposition 8 "because of our religious convictions." The second, also an interfaith service, held after the election was "We Continue to Stand on the Side of Love: A Service of Prayer, Reflection and Hope." Both were well attended not only by members of the Cathedral family but the larger community as well.
- We had several bi-lingual services including the 10:30 Pentecost service in which we used mass settings composed by The Rev. Paul Carmona, our Musician in Residence, and Carols for the City, the 5:00 family service help on Christmas Eve.

## **Acolytes and Chalice Bearers**

---

- The acolytes work closely with the Rev Canon Allisyn Thomas and Dean Scott Richardson and other clergy, under the guidance of the Head Verger, Canon Brooks Mason and the other vergers, to assist at the various liturgical ceremonies held throughout the year.
- At the present time there are approximately 40 acolytes and chalice bearers who volunteer their time to serve at the various scheduled liturgies. On a regular Sunday, there are usually 14 acolytes/chalice bearers used at our scheduled liturgies. In addition, a number of these acolytes make themselves available to assist at weddings, funerals, and other unscheduled activities.
- In May of 2008, our faithful and dependable fellow acolyte Stephen Velez-Confer passed away. Stephen will be missed by all of his colleagues. During Advent of 2008, one extensive training session was held for new acolytes as well as a refresher session for current acolytes. Special training sessions for individuals are often scheduled at other times in order to provide more frequent training options to those who express an interest in becoming an acolyte. New acolytes also have an opportunity to "shadow" other acolytes.
- Several of our acolytes and chalice bearers also serve in other capacities to help enhance our liturgical experience, including serving as Thurifers, Choir members, Altar Guild members, Eucharistic Visitors, and Daily Office Officiants.
- In the year 2009, we will conduct at least two training sessions during Lent and Advent for new acolytes and will continue to provide training as needed to existing acolytes.

## Daily Office Officiants

---

- The Daily Office, or Morning and Evening Prayer, is the pulse and rhythmic heartbeat of the Church's daily praise of God. Marking the hours of each day with set prayer is a practice that originated in ancient times. As early as A.D. 60, the church encouraged morning and evening prayer and, by the fourth century, many churches held public services where regular attendance was expected. The retention and celebration of corporate daily prayer has been one of the hallmarks of Anglicanism. This practice was carried over from the monastic community into the *Book of Common Prayer* in the Daily Office of Morning and Evening Prayer.
- The shape of the Office has a threefold emphasis of "Invitatory and Psalter" (praise of God), "The Lessons" (hearing the word of God), and "The Prayers" (responding to and addressing God). The Psalms are central, readings are less important.
- The readings at the Office are serial; therefore, the Office readings are uninterrupted except by Major Feasts and Saints Days in the Office Lectionary, and Holy Week changes.
- The Officiant (the person who leads the Office), may choose to use Rite One or Rite Two. There are currently twelve volunteers serving as Officiants at St. Paul's. Two Officiants, Jane Vander Velde and Marcus Crim, relocated in 2008 and their service to this ministry has been greatly appreciated.
- During Morning Prayer here at Saint Paul's, we pray for the world-wide church, our companion cathedrals, our diocese, and for each individual in our cathedral community who has requested prayer.
- Morning and Evening Prayer is helpful for those who prefer a structured option to their rule of life.
- The Office is said Monday through Saturday at 8:30 a.m. and Monday through Friday at 5:00 p.m.

## Vergers

---

- The vergers work and plan closely with the Rev. Canon Allisyn Thomas and Dean Scott Richardson to ensure that all ceremonies function as necessary.
- There are nine full time vergers at Saint Paul's: Shawn Anderson (on leave and returning January 2009), Cherie Dean, Bill Eadie, Almira Fort, Canon Chris Harris, Brad Lovelace, Don Mitchell, Stephanie Pierce, and Canon Brooks Mason. In May was the passing of our fellow verger and beloved friend, Frank Palms, who was a tireless and dedicated colleague to us all.
- The cathedral vergers are multi-tasked and dedicated as their responsibilities include coordinating and organizing the ascribed duties of all who serve at the altar. Prior to being a verger, each verger has served as a cathedral altar server while taking on increasing leadership responsibilities. Therefore, a keen sense of liturgy, attention to details, continuous flexibility, and the ability to work well with others are standard qualifications of our vergers.
- Throughout the year, the vergers have served not only at regularly scheduled rites and ceremonies, but also at Evensong, weddings, funerals, special services, and altar server training sessions. The vergers lead the altar servers through rehearsals prior to the 10:30 service and other more complicated special services. Periodically, the vergers are contacted by other parishes for input and guidance on their particular liturgical needs and procedures.
- In the year ahead, we hope to conduct more training sessions for all vergers and servers, train new vergers and continue to work with assisting other parishes in the diocese as deemed necessary. On 22 – 24 October, St. Paul's Cathedral will host the 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Conference of the Vergers Guild of the Episcopal Church. This celebration will include the Feast of St. James Evensong with Bishop Mathes and the Cathedral Choristers, workshops, tours, receptions, and conclude with the Procession of Vergers at the 10:30 Eucharist.

### 2008 Season Highlights:

- ❖ Mr. Braden McKinley was appointed as Organ Scholar in August, 2008. Braden was a member of the boy's choir in the 1990s and brings with him a multitude of talents. It is wonderful to welcome him back to St Paul's!
- ❖ The music department hosted a choral festival featuring Sir David Wilcocks and Duaine Wolfe as conductors. Members of the Cathedral Choir sang as a core ensemble for the festival. Vicki Heins-Shaw and Martin Green served as accompanists.
- ❖ Our boy and girl choristers sang John Rutter's "Mass of the Children" in partnership with the Pacific Academy of Ecclesiastical Music (PACEM) under the direction of the internationally acclaimed composer
- ❖ Our long-standing relationship with the SD Opera and our chorister program continues with a number of our boys and girls appearing in the children's chorus at SD Opera productions.
- ❖ Our choirs sang for nearly 200 services and concerts in 2008!
- ❖ The Cathedral continues to host a number of San Diego performing groups as part of our concert series, and as one of the city's most sought-after performance venues.

### Looking ahead:

Over the last two years, I have been making you aware of the long-term project that will culminate in the restoration of the cathedral's AEolian-Skinner organ. A number of people have been hard at work behind the scenes on this project. Look for more updates throughout 2009.

The Music Department is assisted by our fabulous group of volunteers. There are far too many names to list here, but, suffice it to say that each and every person who gives of their time and talent to the Music Department deserves a tremendous "thank you"!

After seven years as Cursillo parish representative, I stepped down as parish representative three months ago. That however, does not take my continued ministry in serving Him at Camp Stevens.

Again, we did not have any of our parishioners attend Cursillo in 2008. I worked the Spring Cursillo, which had to have been at least the fifteenth time I have served The Lord at Camp Stevens.

This past fall, I was the head Sunday Angel, in which another member of St. Paul's assisted me that day.

Yet despite my stepping down as parish representative, I still hold out hope that most of you can make the closer walk with Christ as I did when I first made my Cursillo in October 1990.

We still look for leaders in the church who we feel are ready for that. Canon Richard Lief continues to be my liaison and a blessing to me.

## Christian Formation

---

### Mission Statement:

"St. Paul's Cathedral will provide a comprehensive, coordinated, and engaging Christian Formation program which emphasizes ongoing spiritual development and service to others in Christ's name."

### Children and Youth

Dr. Luisa Bonillas will outline what has been happening in this area in her own report, but I wish to publicly thank her for her creativity and dedication.

### Adult Education

- The weekly Sunday forum series continued to offer excellent educational opportunities. Dr. David Moseley, along with The Rev. Canon Jack Lindquist conducted a multi-part series on "How to Read the Bible." Other forums included "Fighting with the Bible," lead by the Dean of the California Divinity School of the Pacific, Dr. Donn Morgan, "Is Anyone Listening," with Dr. Gloria Sterling, "Celebrating the Holy in the Ordinary" with Gertrud Mueller Nelson, "Holy Finances" with The Very Rev. Richardson, Canon Chris Harris, Cathedral Nurse Nan Slavin, and Financial Adviser and parishioner George Kuhrtz, a two part series on "The Conversion of England" with The Rev. Anne Chisham, and a four part series on "Holiness in Communications," with The Very. Rev. Scott Richardson.
- In addition to the comprehensive Bible Study lead by Dr. Steward Dadmun, The Rev. Canon Jack Lindquist, Canon for Biblical Studies, lead a Bible Study that focused on the lectionary reading each Sunday.
- Through the efforts of Canon Chris Harris, we held several Wednesday evening series including a *Via Media* program focusing on the baptismal covenant. He also helped organize several book study groups over the summer using the book, *Simpler Living, Compassionate Life*.
- Following last year's *What is An Episcopalian* series we had 2 people baptized, 21 confirmed, 3 receptions and 1 renew his baptismal vows at the Easter Vigil service presided over by Bishop Mathes. This year's class which begins January 21, 2008, already has 40 people registered.
- In addition to *What is An Episcopalian* starting up soon, we will also have a four week series on *Living Wisely* beginning the end of January.
- The Rev. Canon Allisyn Thomas was appointed to the Diocesan Commission on Ministry and is currently serving as Chair Pro Tem.

## Biblical Studies

---

In our Scripture classes we seek to understand every passage in terms of 1) its kind of literature, 2) its historical and cultural setting in the ancient world, 3) our shared humanity with the characters involved, 4) its meaning "then" and its meaning for us "now" in the light of Christ the Word Incarnate.

In 2008, using this approach, we offered a 9:00 AM Sunday Bible Class in the Fireside Room that dealt with the liturgical Scripture lessons for the day, and we will continue this weekly class in 2009. We have some very lively class discussions. Come check it out!

Together with Dr. David Moseley, my good friend and fellow professor in Religious Studies at the University of San Diego, I concluded a 2007-2008 series of fourteen 9:00 AM forums in the Great Hall dealing with "How To Read the Bible." In 2008, we covered the following remaining topics in the series:

- VII. February 3<sup>rd</sup> - "The Genesis Creation Stories" (Lindquist)
- VIII. February 10<sup>th</sup> - "The Testing In the Garden" (Lindquist)
- IX. February 17<sup>th</sup> - "The Prophets: Speaking Truth to Power (Moseley)
- X. February 24<sup>th</sup> - "Jesus' Death and Resurrection in the Synoptics" (Moseley)
- XI. March 2<sup>nd</sup> - "The Formation of the Gospels" (Lindquist)
- XII. March 9<sup>th</sup> - "The Journeys and Letters of Paul" (Lindquist)
- XIII. April 6<sup>th</sup> - "The Gospel of John" (Moseley)
- XIV. May 4<sup>th</sup> - "Finding the Word in the 'words'" (Moseley)

For our Sunday forum series in 2009, David and I will take the five Sundays in Lent prior to Palm Sunday (March 1, 8, 15, 22 and 29) and use them for a journey through all "The Cities and Letters Of Saint Paul." My forum on March 9<sup>th</sup> (see above) was just a glimpse of it. Pope Benedict the XVI has declared this "The Year Of Paul." We think that's a great idea, so we'll have a series on St. Paul's theology right here in St. Paul's Cathedral!

On Sunday, November 9<sup>th</sup>, I offered a special forum to commemorate the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Kristallnacht (November 9, 1938), "The Night Of Broken Glass," when the Nazis burned all the synagogues and vandalized all the Jewish-owned businesses in Germany and Austria, and the enormous Lutheran and Roman Catholic Churches said nothing. It was the beginning of the Holocaust, and from my USD class on "The Holocaust and the Churches" I brought a guest speaker: Auschwitz Survivor Lou Dunst, who lives very close to St. Paul's. By popular request Lou will come back again in 2009!

## **Children, Youth and Family Ministries**

---

This year was a year of growth in my ministry. The following is a list of the programs available to children, youth and their families:

### 9 a.m. Childcare

Childcare is available in the Upper Room during the 9 a.m. Adult Education Hour on Sundays. Children ages 4 and older make fun arts and crafts or play board games while their parents or grandparents take advantage of the many educational offerings available to them during that hour.

### Godly Play

Children ages 4 to 10 enjoy their Christian Education in a storytelling format known as Godly Play. They process at the 10:30 a.m. service on their way to class and join their families again for Communion. The numbers in this program have grown to average about 15 per Sunday.

### Middle School Group

The Middle School Group meets on Sundays at 10:30 a.m. The young people enjoy themselves while learning more about the Christian faith through games and Bible Study. The group is made up of 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> graders and numbers about 11 youth.

### Cathedral Teens Group

The Cathedral Teens Group does currently meet every Sunday. In April, all of the high school youth took part in the Epilepsy Walk. In May, three high school seniors were recognized for their academic accomplishments. They are all three in college now. In the fall a number of the teens participated in San Diego's AIDS Walk.

### Godly Play in Spanish at 2 p.m.

The Spanish Speaking Service Children's Programming is growing at St. Paul's. We regularly have between 10 to 12 children for Christian Education. Godly Play is taught in Spanish but with a bilingual flare as most of these children speak both languages.

### Mom's Group

A Mom's Group met in both the Spring and Fall in 2008. Each semester a book was discussed. The power of prayer and book study has shown its beauty in this new group.

### Mom's Group in Spanish

A Mom's Group for the Spanish Speaking Service began meeting in November. This group brings together a number of young children to play together and a group of moms learning to sew. Stockings were made for each child in the Spanish Speaking service to celebrate the Christmas holiday.

### Confirmation Opportunity for Youth

Confirmation classes will begin for youth ages 11 and older on the first Sunday of March. Through the "I Will With God's Help" curriculum they will come to know their opportunity to serve God and confirm their path in Christianity and the Episcopal Church. The Confirmations will take place during the Easter Vigil Service.

## Library

---

Saint Paul Cathedral's library is located in the Fireside Room on the third floor.

This collection is made of well loved books which have been donated by Church members. The collection has been cataloged and shelved according to the Dewey Decimal System. There is a Card Catalog available for searching for titles and authors.

A Circulating collection consists of Biographies, Fiction, non-Fiction books, tapes, and films. A Reference collection is indicated by a Reference label. Any book with an "R" label is to be used only in the library and not removed from the room.

There is an honor system for checking out books. A table at the Fifth Avenue side of the room holds a basket containing forms for Patron information (name, address, phone number). A book Card is in a pocket in each circulating book for the Borrower's name which is to be left for the Librarian.

An Annual Inventory is done each year. At present, there are 2290 catalogued books in our collection.

No fines are charged for overdue books but all users are asked to return any books they may have borrowed at any time.

Virginia Richardson continues to be a very helpful worker in the Library.

- All are welcome.
- Some visit from time to time, others most of the time, and a small core almost all the time.
- We meet in “The Parlor” under the stairs to the Great Hall across the Queen’s Courtyard from the North Porch.
- Except for occasional interruptions we meet Sundays 9:15 AM to 10:15 AM.
- We are aware that ours is not the only way to study scripture. Members of our group will be delighted to help anyone start and lead a small-group Bible Study.

## Cathedral Administration

---

**Mission:** To provide infrastructural support to the ministries of St. Paul's, including the management of finance and budgeting, human resources, insurance and risk management, office operations, information systems and technology, facilities, grounds, hospitality and special events. The fantastic team that makes all of this possible includes Phil Darby, Sue Foley, Judy MacDonald, Torrey Modic in the office; Coordinator of Finance and Facilities Bob Oslie and sextons Richard Cornwell and Kevin Lucas. Over the summer, we were delighted to have Will Sauter on-board as intern/porter. On a very sad note, we were deeply affected by the loss of Frank Palms, who had been a dedicated staff member for a number of years.

During 2008, significant milestones were:

- Our dedicated staff supported over 1,200 worship services and more than 1,500 meetings, classes, receptions and concerts. Highlights of 2008 included hosting a luncheon for the Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Shori and interfaith Cathedral events in connection with the November elections.
- The Cathedral produced nearly 40,000 worship bulletins during 2008.
- We completed the transition from part-time to full-time bookkeeper.
- We continued our efforts toward becoming a "green" facility. By modifying lighting systems, we have achieved a substantial reduction in the amount of power used. We've continued to implement environmentally sound practices, decreasing the use of disposable products and using LEED-certified cleaning products.
- In order to support the community in fellowship and small group development, we are again offering a dinner option for the What Is an Episcopalian? class this year, as we did for Via Media and the 2008 confirmation class.
- The estate of long-time parishioner Louise Chartres-Martin enabled us to replace the double red doors in the Queen's Courtyard with new doors built to the specs of the original architect, Phillip Frohman.
- Another very generous gift enabled the Great Hall to be painted.
- Additional painting projects have included doors, stairwells, lanterns and exterior trim.
- The Advent Cathedral Clean-up Day was a huge success with more than 55 people working in the church, in the gardens and grounds and public rooms to make the campus beautiful and welcoming.
- Continuing education efforts included attending a two-week program for professional development in the field of church business administration and multi-cultural Visions training. In addition, several staff members have attended facilities maintenance training.

- Responded to research requests for information by Cathedral staff and parishioners.
- Continued research and documentation of our stained glass windows. We will have a comprehensive list of who donated them, when they were installed, repaired, etc.
- Continued work on a manual to provide information regarding basic facts of the cathedral. Hopefully, this will be a useful tool for docents, parishioners and visitors.
- Began work on photographic/descriptive inventory of Cathedral Silver and Diocesan Silver collections.

## Cathedral Nurse

---

Over the past year much of the role of Cathedral Nurse has remained the same, while a few aspects of the position have evolved. The position of Cathedral Nurse remains a staff position supported by the cathedral budget. Nan Slavin has remained in this role. Efforts to better publicize the services of the Cathedral Nurse offered to members and to the local community have been made this year. An increasing number of members have been choosing Healing Touch, as offered by the Cathedral Nurse, to adjunct their traditional medical regime, as well as to promote relaxation and healing. Activities and services available through the Cathedral Nurse include the following:

- **Referrals for health resources** (Assistance answering questions such as, "What services are available that best meet my needs for a specific type of healthcare or personal care?")
- **Assistance with obtaining needed medical services, equipment or medications** (Addressing concerns such as, "I don't have medical insurance right now, so how do I get the medications I need?")
- **Health counseling** (Helping to explore the options to answer questions such as "How do I decide which treatment to choose?" or "How do I cope with this diagnosis?")
- **Health teaching** (Direction in finding answers to questions such as, "What foods are best while I'm taking this medication?")
- **Health advocacy** (Addressing concerns such as "I am confused by, or can't remember what my doctor is telling me to do," or "I don't believe I am getting the services I need from my healthcare provider,")
- **Monthly Blood Pressure Screening**, and individual tracking of blood pressure on a more frequent basis
- **Home/Extended Care Facility/Hospital Visits**
- **Healing Touch sessions, by appointment**
- **"Walking the Journey"** (Simply listening and accompanying another in a difficult time)

Other activities in which the Cathedral Nurse has been involved in the past year

- Participation in Listening Hearts as a discerner
- Pastoral Counseling through the Pastoral Counseling Center
- Providing information on health prevention topics
- Participation in and record-keeping for the Pastoral Care Committee
- Facilitating a book study
- Collaboration in planning for new ministries/services
- Volunteer participation in Project Homeless Connect, outreach to the homeless
- Assisting with training for new Cathedral Visitors

## Dorcas House

---

*Mission Statement: Dorcas House participates in the mission of God to save, educate, and love children whose parents are incarcerated in Mexico.*

2008 was a year of growth, loss and transition for Dorcas House as we began our third year of ministry. Our foster home is in Tijuana, Mexico, where we care for up to forty children whose parents are incarcerated. Our first board president, Dr. Stephen Velez-Confer died from a long battle with cancer May 24, 2008. Of Dr. Velez-Confer, Dean Richardson said, "Stephen's vision for Dorcas House will probably take years and years to live into. But you never get there if you don't have somebody dreaming big dreams." We lovingly dedicate this report to his memory.

The Rev. Canon Barnabas Hunt was elected President and Chairman of the Dorcas House Board/Committee and Colin Mathewson became Volunteer Coordinator. Carolyn Leif, R.N. joined as Medical Team Co-Chair, and Wayne Hatch became Treasurer. Other board members: Terri Mathes, Joan Ford, Dorothy Curry, Andrew Rank, Luisa Bonillas, Hannah Miller and Stan Livingston.

### **Infrastructure:**

- Sylvia Laborin, Executive Director obtained grants in Mexico for a new roof.
- We have all new beds and donated bedding.
- Women of the Choir and the Cathedral Women's Dinner Group made blankets.
- Dorcas House staff protected children during the September 14 Prison Riots.

### **Communications**

- The Dorcas House Online Newsletter began in January.
- A new web site debuted in November and can receive online donations.
- Our hard copy newsletter expanded circulation.
- A professional eight-minute film, "Dance Gabrielle Dance" produced by Dawn, Ford about life at Dorcas House, premiered on October 19 at the Cathedral.
- A three-minute film about Dorcas House premiered on April 4 during the Presiding Bishop's visit. Both films are on our web site.

### **Community Involvement:**

- Over 40% of diocesan parishes have participated through presentations, volunteer work trips, donations or fundraisers.
- Dean Richardson spoke to members of the Church our Savior, San Gabriel and All Saints', Pasadena, as well as parishes within our diocese.
- Tijuana High School students helped DH kids present a Christmas program.

### **Financial Support:**

- Our Angel Gift Tree sold out in one day
- The Alternative Christmas sales here and in Pasadena raised over \$2,000

## Integrity

---

Integrity at St. Paul's Cathedral represents the national organization of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) Episcopalians and their friends in the San Diego area. On the national level, the organization pursues justice for those it represents, particularly around the full inclusion of LGBT people in the life of the Episcopal Church. It engages in advocacy at General Conventions of the Episcopal Church and other major forums, publishes a journal, *The Voice of Integrity*, holds annual conferences, and participates in coalitions with other progressive religious groups.

In addition to providing an ongoing, identifiable voice for LGBT concerns within the diocese, we also provide opportunities for fellowship, peace and justice education and advocacy, as well as parish and community service. Guests and newcomers are always welcome.

- Our participation in the 2008 Gay Pride parade and festival included:
  - ❖ Over 100 people from the Cathedral marching in the parade as a visible presence of support and advocacy for the LGBT community.
  - ❖ Organizing and staffing a refreshment stand and hospitality booth at St. Paul's Cathedral.
- With the support and participation of church members, staff and clergy, we played a very active and visible role in the No On 8 campaign, seeking social justice for the LGBT community by protecting our right to marry. Included events were the showing of the film 'For the Bible Tells Me so' followed by a panel discussion and press conference, two interfaith services with media coverage, staffing phone banks, demonstrating with signs on street corners and fund raising. Our group of 50 participants in the 25,000 member civil rights march following the passage of proposition 8 was seen on national television.
- As a result of our visibility this past year, we have many new people attending services and becoming involved.
- At this time, we anticipate building on the tremendous success of our 2008 monthly meetings which consisted of fellowship gatherings at local, social venues on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of each month starting at 6 PM.
- Moving into 2009, it is very exciting to have energetic people involved In expanding our goals of social activism, evangelism to our community and providing places of connection and support for one another as well as our community at large through social and educational events

We look forward to deepening our mission through continued involvement within the Cathedral, diocesan, and San Diego communities.

## Listening Hearts

---

### Discerning Call in Community

The Listening Hearts ministry continues its aim to make discernment a common spiritual practice at St Paul's Cathedral. We help individuals and groups hear and respond to God's call in their lives by providing trained discernment groups for individuals and training in methods of spiritual discernment in community. Our vision is that the Cathedral congregation will embrace the discipline of spiritual discernment for individual Christians and for ministry groups, and will make use of the resources this ministry provides.

- We worked with the Spiritual Development Commission of the Diocese to provide a workshop at the diocesan Ministry Fair.
- We staff a table in the Courtyard to introduce Listening Hearts to anyone interested after the 10:30am service.
- We provide copies of *Listening Hearts* to all who ask. Most are borrowed and returned.
- We partner with the Time and Talent ministry to offer Listening Hearts discernment to anyone seeking help in determining where God might be leading them. We will continue this collaboration in the coming year.
- We have responded to requests for discernment from twelve seekers over the course of the year.

Our goals for the upcoming year remain generally constant:

- Utilize the principles of spiritual discernment in the life of our own Listening Hearts ministry.
- Ensure that leaders of the Cathedral community will be able to:
  - define spiritual discernment and its importance for individuals and ministry groups seeking to do God's will;
  - identify the resources Listening Hearts Ministry provides; and
  - feel comfortable making use of those resources.
- Provide training in discernment for individuals, using the discernment group method, and for ministry groups, using the *Grounded in God* method.
- Provide enough trained discerners to meet demand for discernment groups.
- Provide opportunities for discerners to utilize and strengthen their skills.
- Collaborate with other groups with similar ministries.
- Become a resource to the larger Diocese of San Diego as well as the Cathedral.

## Money Counters

---

**Mission:** To accurately tally, record and deposit the offerings and remittances received by the Cathedral.

The work of the Money Counters each Monday is a great gift to the Cathedral. Their work, done quietly (okay, they aren't *really* quiet!) makes *every* operational aspect of the Cathedral's life possible. This very dedicated group does a rather anonymous task, but among many other things, they make it possible to accurately and fully report all the contributions and other income received by the Cathedral, to know and monitor our cash position, to report on our budget, to pay our bills and to provide donor statements.

These amazing volunteers spend several hours each week counting receipts and posting income. We have dozens of Special Funds accounts, as well as four Sunday services, eight weekday services, flower offerings, wedding and funeral income, Dorcas House income, rent receipts, investment accounts, etc. to which funds can be posted and the Money Counters must be alert and focused to accurately record all these items. They count the currency, review the checks, and decipher handwriting in order to allocate the funds to the correct general ledger and pledge accounts. They input all that into our database and then balance it all again and prepare deposit slips for our 15 or so depository accounts.

## Nutmeg and Olive, LLC

---

Nutmeg and Olive, LLC, a company established by Chapter, is responsible for managing certain real property for the benefit of the Cathedral, specifically the empty parcel south of the Cathedral at 5<sup>th</sup> and Nutmeg and the parcel directly north of the Cathedral and Great Hall. The LLC members are Dean Scott Richardson, Canon Christine Spalding, Chancellor Kendall Squires, Jack Lentz, and Ken Tranbarger.

In mid-2006, Nutmeg & Olive entered into a contract to sell these parcels to a residential developer, CLB Partners, in exchange for cash, office space, and parking. In 2008, CLB, their consultant team and the LLC continued to process the development. The application for a development permit has been deemed complete by the City's Development Services Department, which is prepared to write a staff report recommending approval. The current design retains the important architectural characteristics of the original work by Tucker Sadler, which many Cathedral members have seen in presentations over the past 18 months. With the vocal support of many parishioners, the project was presented at several community meetings hosted by the Bankers Hill - Park West Association and the Uptown Community Planning Committee (aka "Uptown Planners"). The Uptown Planners' major comment was to insist that a full Environmental Impact Review (EIR) be prepared for the project (as opposed to the Mitigated Negative Declaration that the City recommends). This issue is currently under consideration.

With the crisis in the housing and financial markets that emerged in late 2008, the schedule for the project has become uncertain. We will continue to work with CLB to create and execute a plan that will provide the returns required to obtain financing, be marketable, and fulfill the Cathedral's objectives as stated below:

- Optimize the use of the Cathedral's land assets;
- Provide efficient and effective office and program space;
- Endow Cathedral programs;
- Complete the Cathedral in the spirit of the original design;
- Remain both the spiritual and physical cornerstone for the Community.

Our spending rate remained low in 2008 as we anticipate it will in 2009. As the schedule evolves and the project moves forward, we will continue to need the support of the congregation and neighbors. The Cathedral bulletin and the website: [www.stpaulcathedral.org](http://www.stpaulcathedral.org) will contain progress reports with notices of meetings where your support will be most helpful.

---

## Pastoral Care Programs

---

"Pastoral Care" is the means through which a faith community responds to the needs of God's people through various offerings of ministry. At the Cathedral we are blessed with a variety of ministries, both lay and ordained, through which our members receive spiritual, emotional and physical care.

Pastoral is supervised by the "**Pastoral Care Committee**" convened the fourth Tuesday of each month to review the needs of people upheld Cathedral prayers at our services and by and concerns and ministry for the spiritual well-being of people entrusted to us. This committee includes the Dean, Sub Dean, the Dean Emeritus, the Associate for Children and Family Louisa Bonitas, three Canons for Pastoral Care, The Rev. Ann Chisem, Deacon, our Cathedral Nurse, and the Director of the Pastoral Counseling Center. The Cathedral Nurse provides a confidential monthly report listing persons we know who need our special attention, visits and prayers. This is augmented by the most recent Prayer List of persons for whom prayers are said at our daily services. An accounting is made of persons contacted and/or visited, what challenges are they facing, support systems, and how their wellness needs are being addressed.

The following ministries make this care a resource to those in need:

- **Blood Pressure Clinics** every first Sunday morning after services. Nan Slavin
- **Canons for Pastoral Care:** The Rev. Canons Milton Collins, Dorothy Curry, Gerry Walcutt
- **Cathedral Nurse:** Nan Slavin, RN, BSN, MA, MS (See separate Report)
- **Cathedral Visitors:** Lay visits to those who can not attend services. Cns. Curry and Walcutt
- **Eucharistic Visitors:** Providing eucharist to those who cannot attend services. Cn. Curry
- **Healing Touch:** Non-invasive energy application. Nan Slavin, RN
- **Listening Hearts:** Offering personal/group discernment. Nan Slavin, RN
- **Mobil Health Clinic:** (San Diego Health @ Faith Alliance), provides health care, medication and counseling to those w/out insurance. It's schedule on alternate Thursday mornings is posted on cathedral bulletin boards. Cn. Walcutt
- **S. D. Pastoral Counseling Center:** Dr. James Ewing, Ph. D., Director and Canon Walcutt, Clergy liaison. See Brochure for details.

## Peace and Justice Committee

---

Our baptismal covenant requires us to “strive for peace and justice.” The mission of the Peace and Justice Committee is to engage members of the congregation in working with the broader community for peace and justice. The P&J Committee focuses on addressing issues of injustice, inequality, war, and oppression, and works with other organizations especially with the peace and justice ministries of the Episcopal Church.

We develop and support projects that focus on long-term solutions which consider the root causes of social problems in order to promote social change and resolve structural injustices. Our work this past year included:

- Sponsored or co-sponsored several of the Cathedral Forums, including “Humanity's Great Future” with Frank Kelley, Senior VP of the Nuclear Age Peace Foundation; and “Meet Ambassador Robert F. Ellsworth,” Director of Episcopal Community Services of San Diego.
- Co-sponsored the San Diego premiere of James Carroll's “Constantine's Sword.”
- Sponsored a training session in nonviolent conflict intervention training (NCI) by the international Nonviolent Peaceforce.
- Co-sponsored a trip to El Salvador, and sent Mike Angell and several teens to work with our companion diocese in El Salvador.
- Attended City Heights peace rally sponsored by the San Diego Coalition for Peace & Justice. Rev. Richard Lief and Rev. Mary Moreno-Richardson also spoke at the rally.
- Attended the “Friendship & Hope Vigil,” at Friendship Park to protest the construction of border fence near the coast in San Diego.
- Hosted an “Election Forum” to help attendees become informed citizens and voters.
- Participated in several “No on Prop 8” rallies and initiatives.
- Participated in the San Diego's annual Gay Pride parade.
- Assisted the Associate for Children, Youth, and Family Ministry, Dr. Luisa Bonillas, with a series on the Millennium Development Goals for the Sunday school children.
- Planned and staffed another highly successful Alternative Christmas Gifts Expo, which included gifts to support the work of ERD, Nets for Life, Dorcas House, The Tomorrow Project, and others.
- Updated web page on the Cathedral web site.
- Began publication of electronic newsletters using Cathedral's Constant Contact account.

### **Mission Statement**

The Uptown Faith Community Service Center mission is to help the homeless, poor, and needy, without discrimination, to become self-supporting members of our community.

### **History**

Uptown Faith Community Service Center was founded in 1984 by St. Paul's Cathedral and other local churches as a charitable, non-profit, non-denominational social service agency. Since then local congregations and supporters have joined to serve the homeless, transitional and needy persons in our community through programs of crisis intervention, referrals, sponsorship, case management, HIV/AIDS services, and mail and message service. In 2006, Uptown merged with Alpha Project to provide services collaboratively.

### **Services include:**

- **Living With Dignity - Assisting those with chronic or terminal illness**
- **Distribution of emergency food, hygiene supplies, and clothing**
- **Case Management**
- **Information and Referrals**
- **Mail and Messages**
- **Transportation Assistance**
- **Assistance with ID and birth certificates**
- **HIV/AIDS Outreach**

### **UPTOWN has launched:**

- **On-site HIV/AIDS Services - Every Tuesday, Uptown offers HIV/AIDS testing and counseling between the hours of 10 AM - Noon.**
- **Hospice for the Homeless & Living with Dignity Program** - Each year, more than 100 homeless men and women will die on the streets of San Diego. 06, UPTOWN and Alpha Project launched its Hospice for the Homeless and Living with Dignity Program to provide assistance to veterans, homeless, and indigent people facing end-of-life issues

**In 2007 the Uptown Office was able to double the hours it serves the community.** Doors open at 8:00 AM and close at 5:00 PM Monday through Friday. As a result of the down turn in the economy there are more people who are homeless, including families who show up needing assistance, many for the first time ever. There is a special need for food donations and hygiene supplies.

## Congregational Development

---

2008 saw continued growth of our membership as well as expansion of opportunities for members to get connected to the Cathedral and with each other.

1) **Communications:** 2008 saw the debut of the weekly "Cathedral Life" – an expansion of the printed Sunday announcements. Now divided into "upcoming events" as well as "news & announcements" the publication has more room for photos and better organization. In addition, there is an all new staff and ministry contact page. The e-Bulletin was also re-formatted this year to reflect a similar format and organization style. It was noted this year that readership in the e-Bulletin improved by 30%.

2) **Legacy Giving:** The Planned Giving Committee held St. Paul's Annual Legacy Society Dinner in January, welcoming 12 new members bringing our total membership 81. A planned giving series was schedule for Lent 2009.

3) **Visitor and New Member Ministry:** The Greeter Committee welcomed a new chair, Robert Black, who continued the use of greeter teams. In addition, visitor tables were deployed and several special service and events. More than 450 people signed the guest registry– a new record!

4) **Small Groups & Incorporation:** Work continued on the development and growth of small groups and affinity groups at the Cathedral. A new Via Media series focusing on the baptismal covenant was offered fall which had more than 50 participating as well as a summer Book Study which had more than 60 meeting in small groups to study simpler living.

5) **Time & Talent** - the Spring Stewardship campaign focusing on Time & Talent was formed around a small group, ministry and gift discovery series called S.H.A.P.E, which encouraged parishioners to examine how their unique set of skills, passions, life experience and personality type, might guide them in finding their ministry. The groups met for six weeks in homes of trained facilitators, with more than 100 parishioners participating. The campaign ended with a successful BBQ and ministry fair.

6) **Fall Stewardship Campaign.** This year's campaign continued to expand communications, with four weekly newsletters, a separate stewardship webpage and an online pledge card that saw a doubling in use this year. Under the leadership of David Smith, the stewardship committee was expanded and participation in stewardship events increased over last year. Last year's annual pledge campaign "To Love and Serve" ultimately ended with 434 pledges units (households) totaling \$880,000. As of this writing, the campaign for 2009, "Growing God's Kingdom" has received 400 pledges totaling \$890,000.

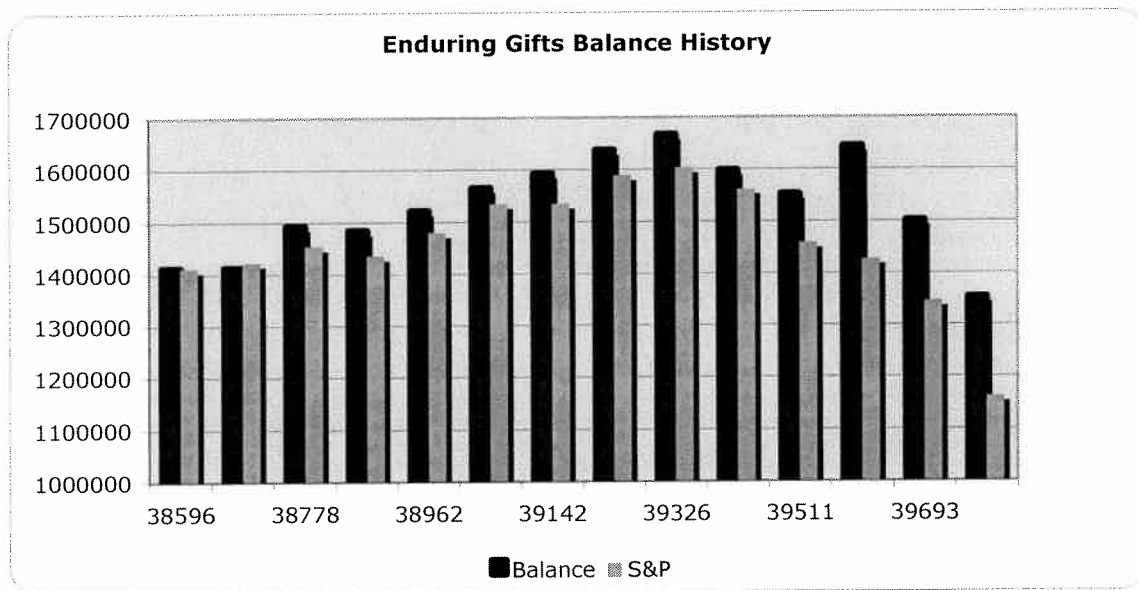

## Endowment Board

---

The Cathedral Endowment Board continued to manage the Cathedral's Enduring Gifts, which include the Cathedral Endowment Fund, the MacKenzie Humanitarian Fund, and the Cathedral share of the Los Angeles Diocesan Fund. The Board also manages the capital portion of the Cathedral Columbarium Fund. Some of the Enduring Gifts donations date back to 1924. These gifts remain intact, and continue contributing annually to support Cathedral programs from portions of the funds' earnings.

This year was an extraordinarily negative period for investments of all types. Despite the Board's employment of a wide diversification strategy, all the Enduring Gifts suffered significant losses, similar to the entire market. The Board has shifted assets to minimize this market effect, and to avoid the need to dispose of depressed equities in order continue funding Cathedral operations. In 2008, the Enduring Gifts distributed \$82,000 to Cathedral programs. The graph below shows the performance (including Cathedral distributions) of the entire Enduring Gifts portfolio through December 2008.



The Board was formed in September 2005, utilizing a charter approved by Chapter. The charter is refined periodically by Chapter to improve the Board's operating procedures. Board membership includes the Dean, the Senior Warden, and the People's Warden, as well as six other parishioners elected by Chapter to serve three year terms. The 2009 Stewardship Campaign, "Growing God's Kingdom," began in October with a series of five stewardship receptions hosted by Norm Friesen, Russ Okihara, Sharon Henry & Karen Austin, and Rev. Canon Joan Ford and Rev. Canon Dorothy Curry, and the committee at the Imperial Towers.
