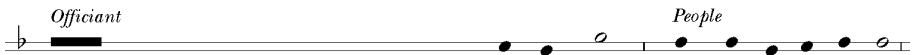

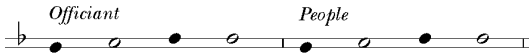

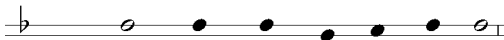

THE FIRST LESSON

Genesis 2:15-17;3:1-7

The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. And the Lord God commanded the man, "You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die." Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?" The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die.'" But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not die; for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

Just as sin came into the world through one man, and death came through sin, and so death spread to all because all have sinned — sin was indeed in the world before the law, but sin is not reckoned when there is no law. Yet death exercised dominion from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sins were not like the transgression of Adam, who is a type of the one who was to come. But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died through the one man's trespass, much more surely have the grace of God and the free gift in the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, abounded for the many. And the free gift is not like the effect of the one man's sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brings justification. If, because of the one man's trespass, death exercised dominion through that one, much more surely will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness exercise dominion in life through the one man, Jesus Christ. Therefore just as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all, so one man's act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all. For just as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.

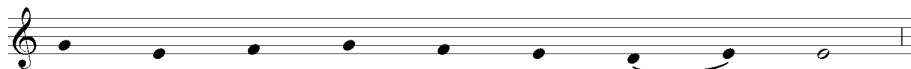

Christ will come again.



This Week in the Episcopal Church

March 13, 2011 – First Sunday in Lent / Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday

At the 2009 General Convention, Lent was officially designated as a time to encourage dioceses, congregations, and individuals to remember and support the life-saving work of Episcopal Relief & Development. All Episcopalians are invited to celebrate Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday on March 13 or another convenient date during Lent.



Originally established in 1940 as the Presiding Bishop's Fund for World Relief, Episcopal Relief & Development is the international relief and development agency of the Episcopal Church and an independent 501(c)(3) organization. Together with the worldwide church and ecumenical partners, the organization rebuilds after disasters and empowers people by offering lasting solutions that fight poverty, hunger, and disease. ERD now reaches over 40 countries and has touched the lives of more than 2.8 million people worldwide. Its programs work toward alleviating hunger and improving food supply; creating economic opportunities and strengthening communities; promoting health and fighting disease; and responding to disasters and rebuilding communities.



Millennium Development Goals: Eight Steps Toward Healing a Hurting World

In 2000, the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) were established to reduce the number of people who live

in extreme poverty by the year 2015. Developed by the international community, including leaders from 191 countries, the eight goals below have been endorsed by development institutions and religious bodies around the world. The Episcopal Church initially dedicated itself to supporting the MDGs at the 74th General Convention in 2003. Putting its commitment into action at the 2006 convention, the church resolved to contribute 0.7% of its annual budget through Episcopal Relief & Development's Millennium Development Goals Inspiration Fund. In 2009, the church renewed its support of the MDGs by endorsing the NetsforLife® Inspiration Fund to fight malaria and by continuing its 0.7% budget contribution through the initiative. Episcopal Relief & Development uses the Millennium Development Goals as a framework to guide and help measure the impact of its work.
