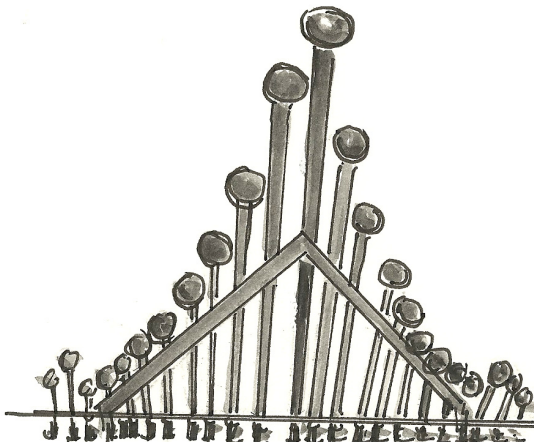

THE FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 25:1-9

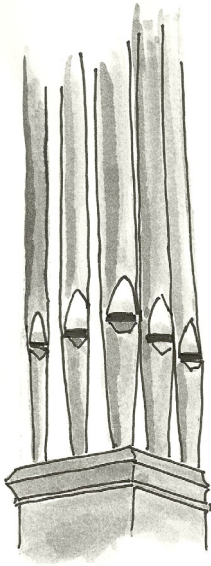



If you want to receive the Cup by intinction (dipping), please allow the chalice bearer to intinct the bread for you. The altar servers all sanitize their hands before the distribution of communion.

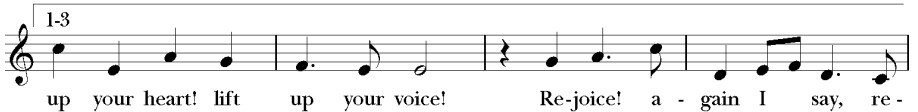
